VPI memorial honours long range patrol aviators

VP International held its annual memorial service at 14 Wing Greenwood October 7. This annual event serves as an act of remembrance for all maritime long range patrol aircrew within the 26 nations comprising VP International killed in training and operations since 1947.

"We are gathering in this place, at this time to honour LRP (long range patrol) avia-

tors," said master of ceremonies Captain Paul Wootten.

"I'm happy to see so many flight suits here today; I know how busy everyone on base is," Lieutenant-Colonel Keith Fugger, VPI president, said, thanking those in attendance.

"Today, we make time to reflect on where we've come from, where we are now, and where we are going."

14 Wing Commander Colonel Jeff Davis, VPI patron, said in his address, "Today, we honour those who made

the ultimate sacrifice. We must not forget our roots, and remember the brave aviators who came before us."

Maritime patrol crews around the world conduct operations in anti-submarine warfare and counter-narcotics, among others.

"This week alone, Greenwood had four crews deployed at the same time."

Chaplain Captain Paul Finnemore invited members to join in a moment of reflec-

tion.

"Our hope in being here today is that those lost in the maritime patrol community will never be forgotten. We remember all those who were part of that community, and we renew our commitment to update the Book of Remembrance."

VPI's Book of Remembrance was first dedicated in 1997. Since then, VPI has promised to "guard it reverently and update it promptly."

Les 26 octobre et 1er novembre, les services aux familles des militaires organiseront une foire de l'emploi virtuelle en deux parties pour les conjoints de militaires à travers le pays dans le cadre du Réseau d'emploi des conjoints de militaires.

« L'avantage d'une foire de l'emploi virtuelle est que, peu importe l'endroit où l'on se trouve, les participants d'un océan à l'autre auront accès à de multiples employeurs qui cherchent à embaucher », ex-

plique Augustina Charles-Frederiksen, gestionnaire des relations externes, Services aux familles des militaires. «C'est l'occasion de mettre les gens en contact avec des opportunités.»

La banque d'emplois actuellement plus de 3590 postes que les recruteurs participatifs cherchent à combler ainsi que plusieurs postes à distance. Cela s'ajoute aux nouvelles possibilités ajoutées quotidiennement au réseau. Les recruteurs de neuf employeurs

Recruiters looking to hire military spouses at two virtual career fairs

October 26 and November 1, Military Family Services will host a two-part virtual career fair for military spouses across the country as part of the Military Spousal Employment Network.

"The benefit of a virtual career fair is that regardless of location, people from coast to coast will have access to multiple employers looking to hire," says Augustina Charles-

Frederiksen, community development and stakeholder relations manager, Military Family Services. "This is an opportunity to connect people with opportunities."

The job bank currently has more than 3,590 positions participating recruiters are looking to fill as well as several remote positions available. This is in addition to new opportunities added to the network daily.

Recruiters from nine network employers, including Bayshore Medical, Canadian Forces Morale and Welfare Services, BMO – Bank of Montreal, Calian Group, Bell Canada, Commissionnaires Canada, NTT, Language Research Development Group and Strongest Families Institute; will be looking to fill a large number of jobs in military communities across the country, including

several work-from-home opportunities. Representatives from the Military Spousal Employment Initiative (federal civil service) will also be participating alongside network employers. These national employers have agreed to offer military spouses with equal and fair access to employment opportunities within their organizations.

Following the conclusion of a similar employment network, Military Family Services saw



the need for a dedicated network for military spouses as spousal employment remains one of the top three issues for approximately 50,000 Canadian military spouses.

Growing steadily, the Mili-

tary Spousal Employment Network has more than 5200 users since it launched in 2018. The network is a self-directed online resource with access to job postings, tools, resources, and events such as training sessions and virtual and in-person career fairs.

Food for Thought from the Upper Room Food Bank

During the month of September 2022, the Upper Room Food Bank in Kingston served 177 families, consisting of 357 adults and 216 children, with 18,145 pounds of product going out and 17,096 pounds coming in. The incoming total includes 7,200 pounds provided by the Feed Nova Scotia network. The rest is from local food bank sharing and donations, including regular arrangements with area businesses.

We have had many requests through our Facebook page for service (booking appointments, registering for programs, what is most needed, etc.). We cannot answer these questions through our Facebook page. We post regular updates and answer simple questions like hours of operation or where to drop off food. For more detailed inquiries, please call the office (902-765-0303) and leave a

detailed message if no one answers. Someone will get back to you. Clients needing service must call ahead to the food bank to arrange an appointment during normal operating hours. If calling outside of food bank office hours, leave a message and someone will get back to you to arrange a time. When ready, volunteers will place the order in the designated area for client pickup. No one other than approved volunteers is allowed in the building. This process limits personal contact, while also reducing waiting time for clients. When requesting service, your best option is to call the office directly, and leave a message if no one is there. Please make every effort to call our office early to arrange your appointment. Volunteers will do their best to help last-minute drop-ins during open hours, but you should come

early and be prepared to wait. Our volunteers will fit you in where they can. We understand it is not always possible to call ahead, but clients will find the process easier with a scheduled appointment. Donations may be dropped off at the food bank behind the library at 669 Main Street, Kingston, during open hours or at the Kingston Village offices at 655 Main Street. Processing of donated food continues following directives from Feed Nova Scotia and the Nova Scotia Health Authority. Cash donations are always accepted.

Our regular hours are in effect, with the food bank open on Mondays, 9 a.m. to noon, and Thursdays, 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Appointments continue to be a requirement. Our office number is 902-765-0303, or email us at upperroom-foodbk@hotmail.com. Be sure to follow us on Facebook! →

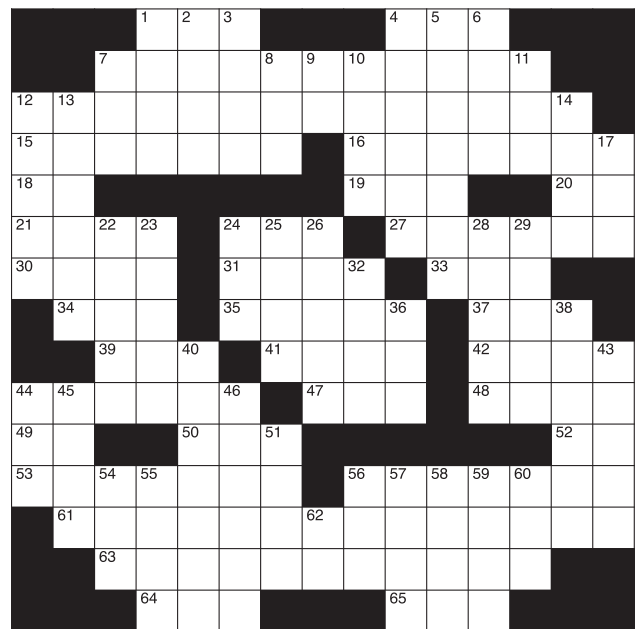
