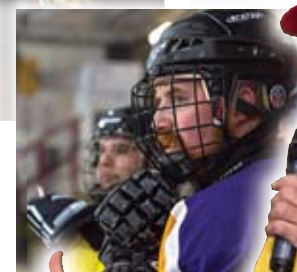

## Success with aviation education, heritage continues

Efforts continue at the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum, with 60-plus volunteers and tremendous support from 14 Wing Greenwood adding up to completed projects, progress on restorations, new displays, a record number of visitors, new programs and new volunteers in the past year.

Led by Lloyd Graham and 20-some volunteers; the museum's "flagship" education program, FlightEd, instructed another 600-plus Grade 6 science of flight students. Nine Valley schools, from Annapolis Royal to New Minas, participated, and the program has now hosted 8,000 students in 14 years.

Ian Patrick, Bob Lorencz and Phil Blumenthal have been working on new LED lighting, making displays come alive. The Argus simulator lighting is now complete, giving viewers a real feel for the instrument displays.

New displays include an impressive base band history, from its inception in 1942. David Kinsman, a local man

who rose through the Royal Canadian Air Force ranks to become Chief of the Air Staff, is also portrayed in a new display. An unserviceable Allison T56 engine was obtained, and volunteer Garry Richards restored it to a cut-away standard, enabling visitors a fascinating view deep inside

this modern power plant. Another completed project was the 1950s Mercury aircraft tug, displayed this summer next to the Lancaster in the air park and, subsequently, stored in the Hercules for the winter months.

The Bolingbroke/ Blenheim restoration has now

completed its eighth year, with the port wing, wing box, cockpit and fuselage completed. Work on the starboard wing is progressing, with the repair of ribs and stringers and re-skinning. The last major work will be the two nacelles and engines; only one Mercury XV engine has

been acquired.

The Piasecki/ Vertol H44 helicopter restoration has seen a lot of detailed work completed, including the cockpit and sliding doors and the forward fuselage prepared for painting.

Final restoration of the Lancaster exterior to its Second

World War configuration as flown by Greenwood's 405 Squadron centres on the rear turret, design, construction and replacement of the mid upper turret; and replacement of the remaining cockpit glass. The restoration is progressing to the point where most work will be completed by summer 2018.

Lots of excitement was generated when a massive C17 Globe Master dropped into Greenwood and dislodged a much-anticipated C45 Expeditor, the latest – and possibly the last – major restoration project for another group of volunteers to undertake.

The museum society has welcomed Perry Matte as its new president, replacing retiring (now vice-president) Brian Handley, who led the museum through the last 10 exciting and productive years. Museum general manager Captain Bob Johnson also recently retired, and is wished good luck with his new endeavours with the Air Cadet League.

## Canadians, Norwegians work together on NATO exercise

A two-week NATO exercise on Vestlandet, under the supervision of the Norwegian

Navy, wrapped up in February. Orion aircraft from Andøya participated, with the Andøya airport used as hosts for participating allies from Canada.

The Royal Canadian Air

Force participated in the exercise, called TG-1, with its surveillance Lockheed CP140 Aurora aircraft.

The Canadians were thrilled with their stay in Andøya.

"It has been very hectic, with a lot of time in the air, but it has been quite nice spending time here," said Lieutenant-Colonel Bruno Baker, 14 Wing Greenwood; to the Vesterålen magazine.

He can't praise Andøya airport enough.

"To arrive at a military base, to work with someone who speaks the same professional language, is just wonderful. The hosts understand our needs, and that helps us integrate a lot faster," said Baker.

He praised the facilities on Andøya, and said the value of operating from a tailor-made base is priceless.

"It is very important to run drills together with our allies, and to do that from Andøya has been truly amazing. This base is really operationally organized, and we like it. We are here to work, and we could not have gotten a better base to operate from than the one we have gotten here."

Although the Canadians have been here in Andøya and Norway to work, they have had the time to enjoy a North Norwegian winter, which has shown itself from its best side.

"I have travelled the world,

but this is the first time I have been to Norway. I am hoping that I will be able to return - I would like more time to spend here and enjoy Andenes," said Baker.

Baker praised the nature on Andøya, and he was glad the crew got to experience a real northern light show.


"We felt like school children again," said a smiling Baker.

Major Cato Eliassen at 133 Luftving staff at the Andøya airport was also very happy with the two weeks they

worked with the Canadians. "It is wonderful they (the Canadians) are satisfied. That is the reason we are here," said Eliassen.


"We are grateful for the good cooperation and relationship we have together. When they are here, they are a big part of raising the level of competence we have here at the 333 Squadron."

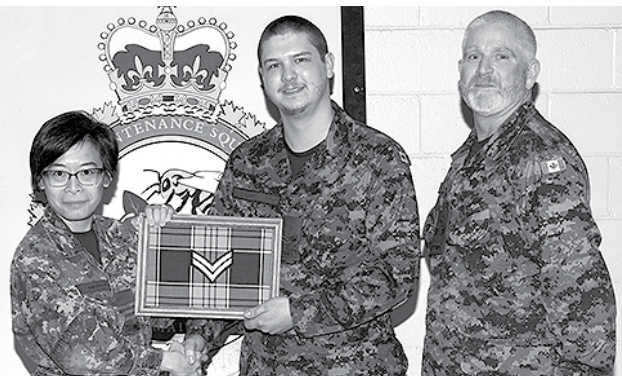

# Mariners ready for basketball nationals after win over Greenwood

The CFB Halifax Mariners are once again Atlantic Regional Basketball champions and, after falling short at the national level in recent years, a dominant win over 14 Wing Greenwood at regionals has the team full of confidence. “We’re absolutely winning at nationals this year,” said Captain Nic Leger, named Halifax’s tournament MVP following the 86-54 gold-medal victory. The tournament was held February 20 to 23 at the Stadplex gym at CFB Halifax, with the Mariners joined by teams

from Greenwood, Shearwater and Gagetown. Halifax has built a regional basketball dynasty over the last decade-and-a-half, with an unbeaten streak in the tournament that stretches all the way to 2002. The Mariners took victories over Shearwater (80-50), Greenwood (56-45) and Gagetown (78-58) to secure a spot in the finals. Greenwood went through with a 93-46 win over Gagetown, a 76-44 win over Shearwater in the round robin and a 73-53 win in the semi-finals, also against Shearwater. Leger said the team’s biggest advantage through the week was its ability to stop opponents’ offense. In the

final game, this allowed the Mariners to widen their lead early and take some pressure off their own scorers. “What always makes us the team that we are is that we come together to play defense. You can’t always control if the shots are falling, but when we work with each other on defense and get a few steals, we always start rolling,” he said. The Canadian Armed Forces National Championship will be held April 7 to 11 at 15 Wing Moose Jaw, and Leger said the team will use the time to keep sharpening its defense and work on team chemistry. With a number of players returning

from previous years, the group is already comfortable together and will look to become an even more cohesive unit. “It’s the same core guys and the same role players coming in and doing their job well, being where they need to be. We’ll be ready to go.”
