

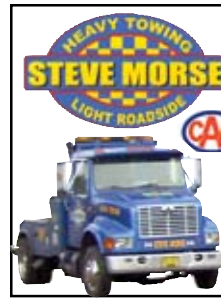

Aldershot adds focus on fitness, facilities

It's a fitness-focussed face-lift. The multi-purpose building known as the drill hall at 5th Canadian Division Support Base Detachment Aldershot is being beefed up: a new gym floor over the old concrete drill hall space, a centralization of three scattered, smaller workout spaces into a modern cardio and weights gym; an investment in equipment and, perhaps most exciting, a staff member to lead base and community fitness and recreation programs. Matt Gillis started as Camp Aldershot's first Personnel Support Program's fitness, sports and recreation coordinator in October.

"The camp has grown, and they were looking for a PSP position for a while," Gillis says. The need grew with an increase in camp facilities' use in the past couple of years, by Regular force members working there daily, to the Reserve units operating at the camp and personnel coming in from the region for training to non-military police forces to Cadets and a desire to open facilities to military members' families, as is common on most other military bases. With the changes in the Force military fitness test, too, a couple of years ago, conducting the evaluations and then following up with training to improve results was becoming too much for military members with primary operation-

al duties. PSP staff working at 14 Wing Greenwood and even Gagetown supplemented some programming, but it wasn't ideal. With the creation of fitness instructor positions across Canada for Reserve Force specific testing, Camp Aldershot was able to make a case for the enhanced fitness, sports and recreation coordinator. Conducting the annual Force fitness testing will be Gillis' main role, plus fitness training and the potential for base intramurals and open military dependants' access. Recreation programming will be developed down the line. "Lots of people are excited, they are coming in to see the work that's been done on the gym and the fitness centre – there have always

been work parties to help me get ready: I've never had to ask for help!" Gillis says. "Aldershot takes care of its people, and I'm all set up with everything I need."

A formal opening of the fitness centre and gym is planned for April 24.

Irvine among RCAF members honoured by governor general

Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Canada Julie Payette presented honours to 48 recipients during a ceremony February 28 at Rideau Hall. She also presented honours in Toronto February 20. Recognized for their excellence, courage and exceptional service to the Canadian Armed Forces and to various military organizations, the recipients were presented with one of the following honours: Meritorious Service Decorations, Decorations for Bravery, or the Sovereign's Medal for Volunteers. Among the recipients were a number of serving members and former of the Royal Canadian Air Force, including former 14 Wing Greenwood Commander Colonel James Andrew Irvine, M.S.M., C.D.; Belleville, Ontario. Irvine received the Meritorious Service Medal (Military Division). He was deployed to Kuwait from November 2015 to June 2016 as part of Canada's contribution to the Middle East Stabilization Force. As commander of Joint Task Force - Iraq, he was instrumental in overseeing its transition from a primarily air-based mandate to a holistic one with new capabilities. He personally led an initial visit to Jordan to develop options for a Canadian capacity building mission. Irvine's outstanding performance solidified Canada's reputation within the multinational coalition. This is the second Meritorious Service Medal awarded to Irvine.

And the band played on... for 150 years

Captain Wendell Eisener, Director of Music, Bridgewater Fire Department Band

April 29, the Bridgewater Fire Department Band will celebrate its 150th anniversary at a 3 p.m. gala concert in Lunenburg's historic St. John's Anglican Church.

The BFD Band will be joined by the 14 Wing Greenwood Band, directed by Warrant Officer Jeff Campbell, and Barbara Butler at the organ and piano. The Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia, His Honour The Honourable Arthur J. LeBlanc, ONS, QC, Honorary Patron of the BFD Band; and Her Honour Patsy LeBlanc will be in attendance.

The concert features music from classical to rock; music that would have been heard on bandstands 150 years ago to the premiere performance of

Nova Scotia-born composer Lucas Oickle's Star Festival, specially written for the band's sesquicentennial.

In an odd bit of historical irony, the BFD band is older than both the Town of Bridgewater (incorporated 1899) and the Bridgewater Fire Department (established 1876).

In 1868, the Government of Canada passed the Militia Act, establishing local militia units throughout the new Dominion, such as the 75th Lunenburg Infantry, the 69th Annapolis Infantry and the 68th Kings County Infantry. As it was unthinkable for a military regiment not to have its own band, these, too, were quickly established. At the same time, the brass band craze had been sweeping the British Empire ever since London's 1851 Great Exhibition introduced the valved, brass instruments known as "saxhorns" to the

world.

Through family ties and business connections, the newly-formed Bridgewater Brass Band became the regimental band of the 68th Kings County Infantry, frequently travelling by rail between its Lunenburg County home, Kings County's Camp Aldershot and Windsor, Hants County.

In the early years of the 20th century, it was thought the human race had evolved to the point where wars would soon be a thing of the past. So, in 1912, many of these local militia units were disbanded (only to be hastily reformed a few years later). By this time, the Bridgewater Brass Band also included woodwind instruments. To reflect these changes in instrumentation as well as its new civilian status, the name was changed to the Bridgewater Citizens' Band.

The band had no permanent home, and lacked professional leadership and, by the early 1950s, was in danger of folding.

In 1952, the band came under the auspices of the Bridgewater Fire Department.

Since then, the band has represented the town and the fire service around the province, nationally and internationally; performing concerts and playing in parades, providing music for private functions and public events both small and large. The 35 members of the band come from all walks of life: from students to retirees, and represent a diversity of playing experience. Only four of the current members have ever served as active firefighters. The band has had 17 directors since 1952. Except for a 10-month hiatus in 2017, Wendell Eisener has led the band since early 2003.

Art acknowledges O'Donnell's 'fully engaged' RCAF career, life

Erin O'Donnell has the picture of her dad, Patrick (Paddy) O'Donnell, used as a model for a new portrait; sitting on her desk.

“Dad would have been so moved to know he was being remembered in this unique way,” she said March 27, as family, friends and former co-workers gathered at the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum.

The late Lieutenant-General Paddy O'Donnell is the subject of the most recent Greenwood Art Association painting presented to the museum. The art association sets out to honour the military achievements of the individuals and crews, and milestone missions, within the maritime aviation community.

Art association president Brian Handley described O'Donnell as “fully engaged all his life.” He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1959 as a radio officer, and later as a navigator; and had multiple flying tours and service on seven different aircraft. He was a trainer and teacher, and was in Greenwood three times throughout his career, including as commander of 405 Squadron and, later, base commander. Further still, O'Donnell led the Maritime Air Group, as assistant to the deputy minister for personnel and served as vice chief of the defense staff. In fact, O'Donnell was a patron of the Greenwood Art Association.

“This reminds me of so many happy memories of Greenwood,” Erin O'Donnell said. “Some things have changed; some have not. This was the best place to grow up. For us and our dad, Greenwood was a time of stability and familiarity; the closest thing to having a hometown

lockers were all full,” Patrick said. “We found two broken ones outside, cleaned them up. He was laying on his bunk with all his stuff still laying about: ‘Is this what maritime flying is going to be like?’ “I told him it wouldn't be the same as what he'd been doing - but it was the most exciting flying he'd ever do. Every flight together for years afterwards, as we landed, he'd call out, ‘First off the plane gets the best bunk!’”

Lieutenant-Colonel Ray Townsend, acting 14 Wing Greenwood commander, accepted the portrait on behalf of Wing Commander Colonel Mike Adamson.

“This initiative is very important: you have to know where you come from to go forward with purpose, and there are so many people that shape your career and life,” Townsend said. “Paddy O'Donnell: think of the family he raised, the people he worked with and the community he was part of.”

as a military family. “When I was little, he'd be gone for days. I'd look up and see every plane, and wonder if it was him. We'd be so thrilled to see him when he came home. It was so comforting to know we were part of a community just like that.” Peter Sayers shared how O'Donnell, who at the time of Sayers' last flight was his commanding officer, stood at the base of the aircraft ladder after the landing. “He asked me if I wouldn't like to do it a little while longer,” Sayers said. “He was a real people person, he would know everyone and all the wives – how? An excellent gentleman.”

Ian Patrick described O'Donnell's introduction to life in the maritime aviation community, as he came to Greenwood from Transport Command. “We were in Puerto Rico, billeted in a stone, double-bunked building with bars in the windows, and the few
