New programs, faces, families mark MFRC year

Good governance was high on the priority list of the volunteer board overseeing operations at the Greenwood Military Family Resource Centre through the past year.

At both the local level, and as a partner in the national network of Canadian Armed Forces' MFRCs, volunteers are "working hard to make sure we're working for the benefit of our military families," said GMFRC board president Kathryn Dalton, opening the GMFRC's annual meeting June 19.

"Our governance training is really important, and governance was the focus of our

App adds access to MFRC services, supports

Numbers, ideas, contacts, services, people – and more – are now at the fingertips of Greenwood's military family community.

A year's worth of work compiling information came

to a head June 19, as the Greenwood Military Family Resource Centre introduced its new app at its annual meeting.

"We heard our family members say 'we're busy, we want to know what's going on, we want to stay connected,'" said project lead Diana

Montgomery. "The app is now 24/7 access to detailed services, staff contacts, all with links to CAFconnection.ca, a mobile-friendly version of our MFRC calendar and newsletter and you can just 'click' to register."

The app offers bilingual access to information on a

range of devices, and is free to download. It can tailor the kind of information and feeds individuals and families might want, whether they're interested in MFRC jobs, programs for adults-only of kids of a certain age, or experiencing a deployment. It also includes some common

checklists particular to a military family's lifestyle: to-do lists and trackers for postings, medical services and release procedures, deployment training and supports.

The app's development was financially supported with supplementary funding from Military Family Services.

fall retreat and the Atlantic MFRC conference a few weeks ago. And, from last year, with-in Military Family Services, we've been anticipating the results of a governance review: governance has been by a board of directors for 25 years, since the beginning of MFRCs – but maybe it's not the best model.”

Dalton said MFRC representatives offered their insights last fall on three options for governance – including the status quo, and Chief of Defence Staff General Jonathan Vance is expected to make the final decision in coming months.

The board and MFRC work has also shifted in the past year with the expansion of funding and programs for veterans and their families. Greenwood launched its new Veterans Family Program June 1.

Margaret Reid, the MFRC's executive director, was unable to present any staff long service awards at this year's annual meeting, as she would normally: the MFRC hired for eight positions in the past year, and six of nine program coordinators are relatively new in their roles.

“We've had a lot of new faces through our doors, and the people remaining while we've had vacancies have kept programs going,” she said.

The widening of programs for veterans and their families has also been accompanied by more programs for different audiences, Reid said: adults only, single parents, “fun” activities for children and more.

Through it all, Reid credited wing leadership, the MFRC staff and board, partnering business and community organizations, and volunteers for combined support.

“You all make it possible for us to ‘live the dream,’ and serve the military community,” she said. “I wish our families could see what we get to see behind the scenes, and what we feel. You all need to realize you are supported.”

14 Wing Greenwood Commander Colonel Mike Adamson said the reach and success of the Greenwood MFRC really hits home as he travels across Canada and meets other wings' leadership teams.

“We're lucky. Coming back to Greenwood for me and

many others is returning to a ‘family.’ We ‘Operate as One’ at the wing level, and we are all in this together – and nothing embodies this better than our MFRC. We have a good organization, and we do a great job here creating a family environment and culture people want to remain a part of.”

Elected for two-year terms on the board of directors were Laura Fox and Kate Archibald, both of whom joined the board in recent months filling vacant seats and now taking on more formal appointments.

Financially, the GMFRC finished 2017/ 2018 “in a very good position, said board treasurer Justin Kubis. Military Family Services provided \$865,884 of the MFRC's total \$1.3 million revenue. Program income generated \$270,115, and fundraising another \$8,148. The MFRC spent \$159,067 on programs, and had \$1,088,157 in expenses, including \$642,520 on salaries and benefits, \$292,639 on child care and early education salary and benefits, \$18,232 on professional fees and \$18,938 on the board. The MFRC finished \$64,416 in the black.

Program funding links seniors with library support, training

The Annapolis Valley Regional Library has received a grant in the amount of \$24,571 from the federal New Horizons for Seniors Program to provide tools and training to enable seniors with a print disability to participate in social programs offered in their community. This project

also aims to help seniors feel comfortable using the technology, and to be safe in that environment.

The project will be multi-layered, providing not only devices such as DAISY players and tablets, but also the skills to use this technology. Needs - such as access to reading materials for book

clubs, confidence to use online banking and training - have been identified by AVRIL and community groups that work with seniors, and this project will involve groups such as the VON, church groups and senior’s facilities.

Numbers from Statistics Canada suggest about 10 per cent of Canadians may

have a print disability, which limits people’s ability to read in traditional print format. Many people who do not currently have a print disability will have one in the future. This would mean more than 10,000 individuals have the potential to use service in the area served by the Annapolis Valley Regional Library.

Partners launch veterans’ services, program

The hub of services for military members and their families that is the Military Family Resource Centre has now grown.

June 1, the Greenwood MFRC launched the start of its Veteran Family Program service, ready to support Veterans Affairs Canada’s April announcement to include medically-releasing and -released veterans and their families in MFRC programming. This includes new transition programs, referral services and intervention support as members and veterans transition from military to civilian life.

Newly-hired Veteran Family Program coordinator Sarah Osborne was on hand, with a room full of displays featuring community part-

ners offering services that will enhance the Veteran Family Program.

“We want to develop strong relationships with our partners – you all provide opportunities for our veterans to re-identify with a community,” she said. “This will be a safe, supportive and healthy environment for veterans, with a trusted and empathetic listener in the MFRC to support your needs.”

West Nova MP Colin Fraser serves on the national Veterans Affairs Committee, and said he is particularly pleased to see this new program launch here in his own riding, but also at 32 MFRCs across the country.

“The MFRCs are absolutely critical in that transition, and we’re opening up MFRCs to veterans and their families,” Fraser said. “Some of the challenges include psycho-

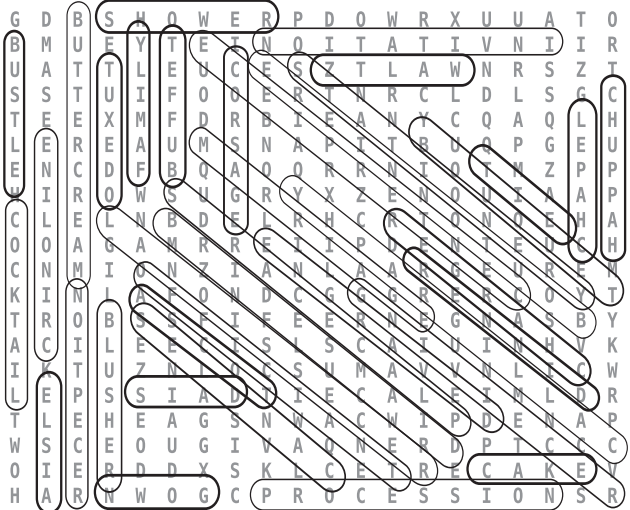
