## Greenwood undefeated, wins Atlantic ball hockey title

By 6:30 a.m., the aircraft was stood down, returning to 14 Wing Greenwood just before 8 a.m.

June 16, close to 3 p.m., a Greenwood-based Cormorant launched to assist with the search for a missing 14- to 16-foot open fishing vessel with two people reportedly on board, off the New Brunswick coast. The vessel had left shore around 4 p.m. June 15, with no contact received since. The Cormorant returned to Greenwood around

4:30 p.m.

June 22, just before 5 p.m., a Cormorant was set to launch in aid of a search for an electronic beacon sounding near Halifax. The search was called off shortly afterward, with the helicopter back in Greenwood just after 6 p.m.

June 23, a Greenwood Hercules provided top cover for an overnight call, as a Gander-based Cormorant rescued four people who had abandoned their burning vessel 85 miles east of St. John's. The aircraft was then re-tasked to search for an overdue 18-foot vessel; after it was found, the Hercules stood down, fuelled in Goose Bay and returned to

Greenwood around 9 a.m.

June 23, a 14 Wing Hercules aircraft was tasked at 12:30 p.m. to respond on a call for an ELT sounding from a helicopter approximately 22 miles north-northwest of Sept-Îles. It departed Greenwood just before 2 p.m. The plane was stood down while en route, as the locator beacon was reported activated by accident.

June 24, just before 8 p.m., a Cormorant helicopter launched from Greenwood to search for an individual reported leaving a wharf in an open boat from Caraquet, New Brunswick. A Hercules was also tasked, but stood down before take-off. The helicopter returned to Greenwood before 1:30 a.m. June 25, as RCMP continued the local search.

June 25, both a 14 Wing Cormorant and Hercules were in the air around 7:30 p.m. to Iqaluit, in support of a search and rescue tasking for a missing boater in the vicinity of Cape Dorset. The Cormorant headed directly to the scene, while the Hercules went to pick up a Gander CH149 crew, then ferry them to Iqaluit. A second Greenwood-based helicopter and crew were later tasked to hold a two-hour standby out of Matane, Quebec, until the primary helicopter and crew returned from the scene. Around 11 p.m. June 26, the Greenwood aircraft

and crews were stood down, returning the Gander Cormorant crew back to base en route to Greenwood. The Hercules was expected at 14 Wing around 9 a.m., followed by the Cormorant around 5 p.m.

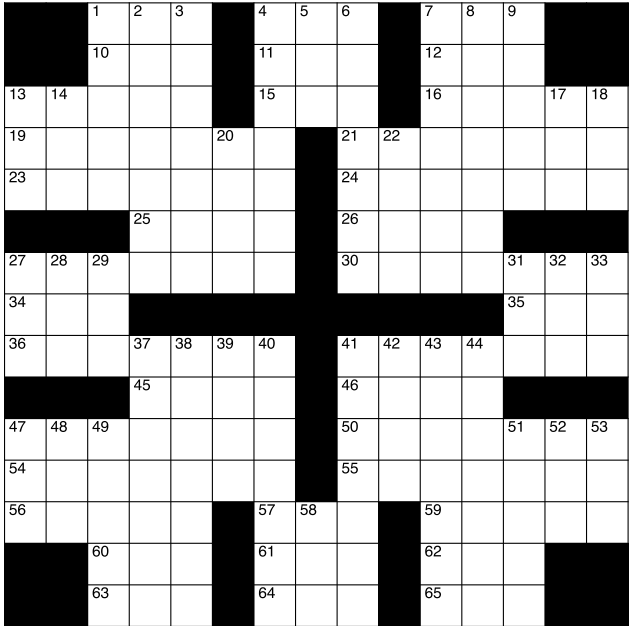

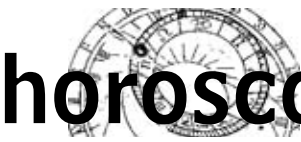

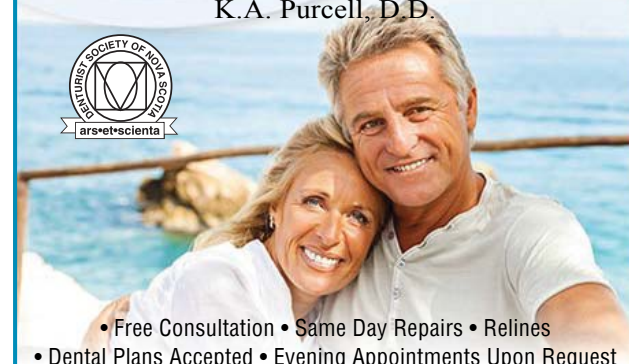
