## 14 Wing members join Op Impact Roto 7 training

It was under meteorological conditions nearing that of the Middle East August 8, as Air Task Force Impact (ATF-I) Roto 7 began its pre-deployment training at 3 Wing Bagotville.

The members of ATF-I Roto 7 were brought together at a purpose-built camp, alongside the runway. Most personnel are from 14 Wing Greenwood, but others come from wings across Canada, including one member from Kingston, Ontario; 15 from Moose Jaw, 17 from Winnipeg, 19 from Comox and 22 from North Bay.

The purpose of the 14-day exercise, which duplicates as close as possible the working conditions in the theatre of operation, was both to complete the collective training of members of ATF-I and to confirm their operational readiness prior to departure.

To implement this exer-

cise, 2 Air Expeditionary Training Squadron (2 AETS) developed, with the help of the Royal Canadian Air Force Aerospace Warfare Centre, a pre-deployment curriculum with a building block approach, tailored to the operation. To support senior trainers from 2 AETS and render the exercise even more realistic, a number of experts from elsewhere in Canada and in the current theatre of operation helped implement the training.

"2 Air Expeditionary Training Squadron is mandated to provide standardized training for the Royal Canadian Air Force, and thus prepare members of the Air Task Force to be ready to carry out their duties once deployed," said Lieutenant-Colonel Steeve Belley, Commander of 2 AETS.

The members of Roto 7 would, by the end of the ex-

ercise August 21, be ready to be deployed as part of the ATF to replace their Roto 6 colleagues.

Since the start of Op Impact in August 2014, Royal Canadian Air Force aircrafts have conducted more than 4,485 air sorties over Iraq and Syria. In that region, ATF-I currently operates a CC150 Polaris air-to-air refueller, two CC130J Hercules tactical aircrafts

## Concert in the park celebrates RAF, RCAF contribution in music

The 14 Wing Greenwood Band and the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum have collaborated over the past five years, presenting annual concerts to commemorate the Battle of Britain. These concerts have been an important fundraiser for the museum and provided Greenwood audiences with an enjoyable afternoon of music to mark this critical turning point in the Second World War. This year, the concert is moving outdoors, as the Village of Kingston will host the event at Centennial Park's Beaman Bandstand September 16 at 3:30 p.m. The park

provides a beautiful setting for the concert and excellent acoustics under the wooden bandstand. Bring your lawn chairs, and enjoy the sounds of the 14 Wing Band and guest vocalist David Holborn. Holborn will be performing a powerful medley of wartime songs composed for the Royal Air Force Central Band. The concert will also include Holst's "Second Suite," the "Luftwaffe March" and Gershwin's "Strike Up the Band." Sergeant (retired) Dave Hankinson will be featured on flugelhorn in a unique arrangement of Piazzolla's "Oblivion." ## No rest for SAR crews over long weekend

September 1, a 14 Wing Greenwood just before 8 a.m. Hercules left to assist in the search for a person reported missing overboard from the marine vessel Precious Jewel, approximately 120 miles east of Newfoundland. The assigned search area was covered with nothing found, and the Hercules returned

to Greenwood, landing just after 9 p.m. September 2, a Greenwood-based Hercules was sent just before 8 a.m. in top cover assistance for a Gander Cormorant, responding to a medical emergency. The patient was medevaced from a large vessel, approximately 180 nautical miles southeast

of St. John's, and transferred to hospital. The Greenwood aircraft arrived home just before 2 p.m. September 3, just after 9 p.m., a Cormorant departed Greenwood to search for an undetermined "object" which a concerned citizen saw fall in the water off PEI. The helicopter returned to Greenwood

around 11:30 p.m., having found nothing of note. September 3, three kayakers overturned near Gardner Creek, New Brunswick, around 2:30 p.m. Both a Greenwood Cormorant helicopter and a Hercules aircraft were tasked to assist. However, all three kayakers were able to make it to shore


before either aircraft made it on scene; the individuals were provided medical assistance once ashore and both aircraft were stood down just before 3 p.m.
