## Bombers women undefeated at Atlantic championships

The Greenwood Bombers women's soccer team dominated the Canadian Armed Forces Atlantic Regional soccer championship in Gagetown August 21 to 25.

Not having won a single game at regionals since 2019, the team trained hard all summer and played in the Valley District Soccer women's league to prepare for what would be a hard week of competition.

"Our team hasn't been favoured to win in a long time, we've always been the underdogs and haven't been taken seriously," assistant team captain Corporal Kristine Kennedy said. "This year's team was a group that melded together, on and off the field. Everyone held their own and performed their

role on the field beautifully. We created a winning team together, and I'm elated to be a part of it."

August 21 was a travel and training day for the team; then, following the opening ceremonies August 22, the Bombers faced the hometown team and reigning regional 2022 champions, the Gagetown Warriors. After the first 45 minutes, Greenwood had a 1-0 lead with a goal from Corporal Brandi Weibel. In the second half, the Bombers secured the win with a goal from Aviator Kas Selwood and another from Weibel, to bring the final score to 3-0.

The Bombers' second game kicked off later that same day (the only women's team to have to play twice in one day) against the Halifax

Mariners. Thanks to a goal from Lieutenant Sophia King in the first five minutes, and hard-fought defence the rest of the game, the Bombers held on for a 1-0 win, earning them a bye to the finals Friday morning.

"Going into the tournament, our goal was to make it to the finals," said coach Captain Glenn Duncan. "After winning both of our games on day one, I knew we stood a good chance of

winning the whole thing."

In the final match of the round robin, Gagetown topped Halifax 2-0, with goals from Corporal Anouk Trottier-Boucher and Sergeant Stephanie Munro, but this game was considered a "rubber match," since the two teams would face each other again the next day in the semi-finals. This time, Halifax came out ahead 2-1, with both Halifax goals scored by Sailor Second

Class Becka Whey and the lone Gagetown goal from Master Corporal Ally Mabie.

It was cool and overcast for the Friday morning final between Greenwood and Halifax. Both sides played hard: Halifax had many shots on net, hitting the post at least four times and Greenwood goalkeeper Private Ana Messier made multiple spectacular saves. In the 94th minute of play (the full 90 minutes plus

five minutes of stoppage time due to injuries), Weibel went on a breakaway and scored, ending the deadlock between the two tough opponents, winning the game - and the tournament, for Greenwood.

"It felt unreal to score the winning goal," Weibel said. "I thought the game would go into overtime so, when I had the opportunity to

...cover score and it worked, I was ecstatic! Everyone put such hard work into that entire game. It was amazing to be able to bring it all together and win."

Throughout the week, the Bombers were undefeated and goalkeeper Messier conceded zero goals, earning the award for most valuable player of the women's tournament.

"I was surprised to get MVP," Messier said, "but I'm really happy to have received it. The amount of work and effort that everyone put into the game made me

proud as a keeper. It made my job easier, for sure."

On the men's side, Greenwood did not have enough players to put in a team, but Corporal Wes Aucoin, a firefighter with 14 Mission Support Squadron, went as a "floater" and got picked up by Halifax to play goalkeeper. The men's teams from Halifax and Gagetown faced off in a best-of-five series. Game one went to Gagetown 3-2, after two 15-minute halves of extra time and a shootout. Halifax dominated in the second game, winning 3-0. Game three also went to extra time and a shootout, and Halifax

came out on top 3-2, putting them up 2-1 in the series. In game four, Halifax defeated Gagetown 5-0, winning the series and earning their ticket to nationals. Aucoin gave a solid performance in goal every game and earned the tournament MVP for the men's competition.

The Atlantic regional champions, the Greenwood Bombers women's team and Halifax Mariners men's team, will both attend the CAF National Soccer Championship at CFB Borden September 23 to 28. For information, and to watch the semi-finals and finals live, check out the CAF Sports Facebook page.

# Nova Scotians: prepare now for hurricane season

Nova Scotia is entering the height of hurricane season, and now is the time for residents to prepare for these extreme weather events.

"I know we're all feeling weather-weary, but hurricane season is upon us," says Municipal Affairs and Housing Minister John Lohr, minister responsible for the Emergency Management Office.

"The best time to plan and prepare is before a hurricane or tropical storm occurs. Taking steps now to make an emergency plan and kit will ensure you and your family, friends and neighbours are ready before a storm reaches our province."

A hurricane's strong winds and heavy rain may cause power outages, storm surges, flooding and property damage. People may get ready in advance by having an emergency kit with food, water, medications, important documents and supplies to last for several days; preparing property by trimming trees, securing loose items and clearing gutters and storm drains; making a plan for their families now, before one is needed.

Environment and Climate Change Canada is warning of an active hurricane season this year, and is reminding Nova Scotians to closely monitor the WeatherCAN mobile application, Canada.ca/weather or its other weather channels for official hurricane alerts. Hurricane season runs from June to November, with Nova Scotia experiencing peak storm activity in late August and September.

Municipalities are responsible to have an emergency management plan in place and would lead the response to events in their areas. Nova Scotia's emergency management office works with municipalities to help them plan for emergencies and supports response efforts when major events happen. # L'escadre a un rôle et une responsabilité dans le recyclage et la gestion des déchets

Restes de cuisine, emballages en plastique, papier d'aluminium et autres : il y a tant de sortes de déchets ménagers à éliminer.

Tous les objets ne sont pas identiques et ne peuvent pas tous être jetés à la poubelle ! La diversité des objets que nous utilisons au quotidien et dont nous devons nous débarrasser, que ce soit en les jetant à la poubelle, en les recyclant ou en les mettant dans la poubelle verte, peut être source de confusion.

Heureusement, Valley Waste Resource Management (VWRM) est là pour nous aider à savoir ce qui peut ou ne peut pas être jeté, et comment le trier. VWRM, situé à Lawrencetown et Kentville, dessert la

14e Escadre Greenwood en collectant les déchets de la base et des unités d'habitation résidentielles. En plus de nous servir à la 14e Escadre, ils s'occupent de huit secteurs et de 17 autres communautés dans la vallée de l'Annapolis.

En tant que membres de l'Équipe de défense, et ceux qui vivent avec les membres de l'Équipe de défense, représentant le gouvernement fédéral, le personnel de la 14e Escadre Greenwood devrait être tenu de respecter des normes élevées, de rendre compte et d'être responsable des engagements de la base, de la communauté et de l'environnement. En comprenant où vont nos déchets, la 14e Escadre

peut donner l'exemple au reste de la communauté en montrant l'importance du tri des déchets. En réduisant et en triant les déchets, nous pouvons également prolonger la durée de vie des décharges et réduire notre empreinte carbone.

Il est important de trier nos déchets en quatre catégories : les ordures (dans des sacs transparents), le papier recyclé (dans des sacs bleus), les contenants recyclables (dans des sacs bleus) et les matières organiques (poubelle verte). Les piles, les appareils électroniques, les pièces automobiles, les pneus, la peinture, les bombes aérosols, les matériaux corrosifs et les ampoules ne peuvent pas




être jetés dans les poubelles ordinaires. Bon nombre de ces articles peuvent être apportés aux centres de gestion de VWRM. Pour en savoir plus sur les déchets non ordinaires et les lieux d'élimination, visitez le site Web de VWRM,

- Move yard furniture and secure anything that can be picked up by wind like trash cans, patio chairs and umbrellas
- Move important items from bottom level in your home to higher floor
- Check radio and flashlight batteries
- Fill vehicles with gas and park them away from trees
- Charge electronic devices
- Keep pets inside
- Check on family, neighbours, and friends who may need help
- In an emergency situation, call 911 for help

# Wing has role, responsibility in right way to recycle, manage waste

Kitchen scraps, plastic wrap, aluminum foil and more: there are so many different kinds of household garbage to be disposed of.

Not all items are the same, and they can't all go in the garbage! With so many different items we use in our day-to-day lives we need to dispose of, either as garbage, recycling or into the green bin; it can be very confusing.

Luckily, Valley Waste Resource Management (VWRM) is here to help us know what can and can't be thrown out, and how to sort it all. VWRM, located in Lawrencetown and Kentville, services 14 Wing Greenwood by collecting base and Residential Housing Units' waste. In addition to servicing us at 14 Wing, they look after eight areas and 17 other


communities throughout the Annapolis Valley.

As Defence Team members, and those who live with Defence Team members, representing the federal government; 14 Wing Greenwood personnel should be held to a high standard, accountable and responsible to base, community and environmental commitments. By understanding where our waste goes, 14 Wing can set an example for the rest of the community to show the importance of sorting waste. By reducing and sorting waste, we can also extend the life of landfills and reduce our carbon footprint.

It's important to separate our waste into four categories: garbage (in clear bags), recycled paper (in blue bags), recyclable containers (in blue

bags) and organics (green bin). Some items that can't be included in the regular garbage disposal include batteries, electronics, auto parts, tires, paint, aerosol cans, corrosive materials and light-bulbs. Many of these items may be taken to VWRM's management centres. To find out more about non-regular garbage disposal items and locations of disposal, visit VWRM's website, wrm.com.

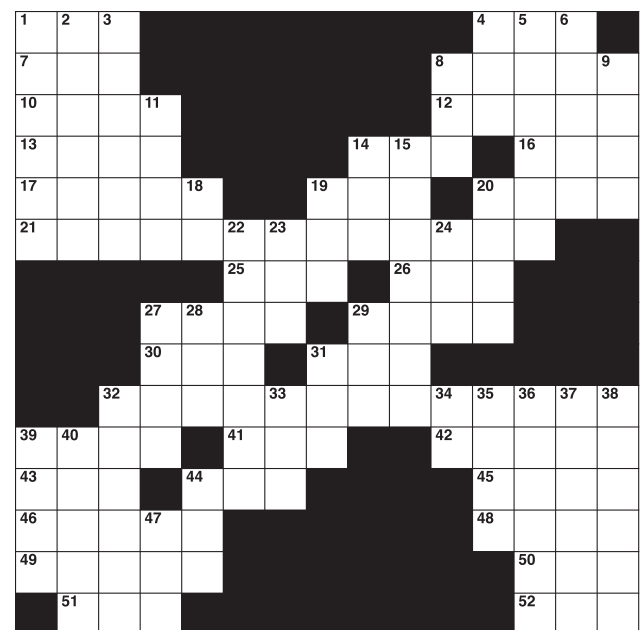
